

**GUERNSEY KART AND MOTOR CLUB LBG
SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS
KART RACE MEETINGS – SUMMER SERIES 2010**

1. The Guernsey Kart and Motor Club LBG (GK&MC LBG) will organise a Clubman's Permit Kart Race Meeting on.....at The Track, Victoria Avenue, St Sampsons, Guernsey.
2. The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of the MSA Motor Sports Association Limited, (Incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), the Supplementary Regulations and written instructions issued by the GK&MC LBG.
3. The Track measures 400 Metres, has 6 corners and the surface is of Tarmac.
4. MSA Clubman's permits have been applied for.
5. The event is open to all fully paid up members of the GK&MC LBG, Jersey Motor Cycle and Light Car Club and Jersey Kart Club.
6. All competitors must produce a valid Competition Licence and Club Membership Card when signing on.
7. The event is a round of the Guernsey 2010 Summer Championship consisting of nine rounds. A maximum of seven rounds will count for the championship.
8. The programme times will be:
Signing on closes 60 minutes before the scheduled start.
Scrutineering closes 30 minutes before scheduled start.
Drivers briefing 15 minutes before start.
Pre-race practise commences at scheduled start time.
9. There will be three heats and a final per class (numbers of laps and heats may change subject to time restrictions)
Cadet Heats will be 10 laps and the Final 15 laps.
Junior Heats will be 10 laps and the Final 15 laps.
Senior Heats will be 15 laps and the Final 20 laps
Additional races will be held if time permits.
10. Each competitor will have the opportunity of taking part in a practice session of a minimum of 3 laps.
11. The event is open to MSA/ABkC classes described in paragraph 21 of these Supplementary Regulations (where grids and time allow).
12. Trophies may be awarded for the heats and the overall Class Championships and additional trophy races may be included in the programme of events. Points awarded for the heats positions will be added to the points awarded in the finals to give an overall total for final championship standings. Points will be awarded as follows:-

Heats 1st=12, 2nd=9, 3rd=7, 4th=6, 5th=5, 6th=4, 7th=3, 8th=2, all karts that complete at least 50% of the race distance will be classed as a finisher and awarded points on a roll back of laps basis, all karts that take the start will be awarded 1 point.

Finals – 1st=24, 2nd=18, 3rd=14, 4th=12, 5th=10, 6th=8, 7th=6, 8th=4, 9th=2, all karts that complete at least 50% of the race distance will be classed as a finisher and awarded points on a roll back of laps basis, all karts that take the start will be awarded 2 points.

In the event of two or more drivers finishing on equal points in the championship the winner will be determined on the most number of finals wins followed by 2nd, 3rd places etc. until a winner is declared. If there is still a tie after this, heat wins and positions will be taken into consideration. Any further tie, then these drivers will be declared as joint winners.

The above method will also be used to determine lower place awards if necessary.

13. The minimum entry for the meeting is 10. The maximum for each race is 14, the minimum is 3. Should any of the above figures not be reached, the organisers reserve the right to cancel the meeting or amalgamate races or classes as necessary. Entries will be selected on receipt of entry.
14. The entry fee is £30 Senior and £24.00 Junior and Cadet. Late entry will be charged an additional £10.00 penalty. Entry on the day will be charged double. Entry fees may be refunded as follows:
 - (A) on production of a Doctors Certificate
 - (B) in event of cancellation 50% of entry fee
 - (C) entry fees may be forwarded to a following event provided that the Competition Secretary is notified by 9pm of the evening prior to the event for which the entry is to be cancelled.

17. All protests must be logged in accordance with the relevant sections of the current MSA year book.

18. Starting positions will be determined by ballot for the first heat and the invitation races. The second and third heats will be by rotation. Novice drivers must occupy the rear most grid positions in the heats only. The grid positions for the final will be by the greatest number of points gained from the heats for all competitors including novice drivers. Timing and lap scoring will be by transponders. All drivers will need to supply transponders fitted to the back of the seat in compliance with MSA guidelines.
19. Marking and Penalties will be printed in the appropriate section of the MSA General Regulations except as modified below:
If during the course of a meeting a Competitor is found to be in breach of noise regulations, he/she may be given a back grid position for his/her next race. Continual abuse may result in exclusion.
20. Cadet/Junior incident marshals will be allowed on the circuit provided they have signed on and are wearing fluorescent safety bibs. They shall be positioned around the circuit and in accordance with the race officials. There must be an incident marshal available on the circuit for each Cadet competitor.

All classes: All Chassis and Engines must comply with the MSA/ABkC regulations for their class subject to the above.

22. With the exception of the pit area, officials only will be allowed in non-spectator areas, other than one person per Junior and Cadet competitor during practice and racing (and who must have signed on).
23. After receiving end of race or practice signal, Karts will maintain station and proceed at a reduced speed to the pits and slowly enter the roped off area.
24. If any signed on person needs to be transported by ambulance they will be charged by the St. John Ambulance.
25. Competitors who are currently disqualified from driving on the public highway for 6 months or more will not be able to participate in this event.
